

AISD, Spring ISD to remain in District 16-6A after UIL realignment

Aldine ISD's five high schools will continue to compete against Spring ISD in District 16-6A, the University Interscholastic League (UIL) announced on Thursday, Feb. 1 during the UIL's biennial realignment.

Aldine ISD schools will compete with DeKaney High School, Spring High School and Westfield High School in athletics, performing arts and extra curricular activities beginning in the fall of 2018.

District 16-6A will consist of Aldine High School, Davis High School, Eisenhower High School, Mac-Arthur High School, Nimitz High School, DeKaney High School, Spring High School and Westfield High School for the next two years.

Aldine ISD and Spring ISD will compete in Region II for the next two years.

AISD will not need to make changes to the grading cycles or the last day of school, which will remain May 31, 2018 for students and June 1, 2018

agreed that this was the time for action to solve the flood problems of the area.

Emmett said that Harvey had changed our lives. and changes are needed in the regulations that govern building. He said they were based on a 100 year flood plain, when actually that most recent floods, 3 in 3 years, indicate a 500 year flood event instead. He said this change was being implemented in the county since January 1st.

Both leaders said that more money was needed, to help those who are suffering from the Harvey floods, and to improve infrastructure to minimizing flooding in the future.

Emmett said that a new third reservoir was needed, probably at a cost of more than \$500 million. He noted that these reservoirs are federal projects, not

county. Turner noted that the city's drainage fee was not intended to solve flooding problems, and flood projects would cost billions. Both speakers said that the state should re-

lease some of its "rainy day" fund to Houston.
"If this isn't a rainy day, what is?" they quipped.

Emmett noted that Congress had appropriated \$51 billion for flood, and had another hill that would release \$81 billion for natural disaster relief in four states. They urged quick action to pass this, but said it wouldn't be enough.

Emmett said that the County was planning on having a bond referendum later this year for the Flood Control District and the public would have to decide whether they would pay for flood relief.

In the question period. Cynthis Neely asked why projects could not be required to retain 100% of their water run-off.

Environmentalist Jim Blackburn noted that Harvey was not a surge event but a rain and wind storm, and that a surge event would have been even more devastating. Plans for a so-called "Ike Dike" have been forwarded, but the cost is into many billions, he said.



Charges have been filed against a suspect arrested in the shooting of a man at 7202 Jensen Drive about 10 p.m. last Wednesday, January 31.

The suspect, Rubin David Carrasquillo, 26, is charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and felon in possession of a firearm. He is accused in the shooting of Paul Fruge 44, who was transported to an area hospital in critical condition. HPD Major Assaults

DPS Ramping Up Move Over/ Slow Down Enforcement

AUSTIN - The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) is beginning enforcement efforts across the state focusing specifically on violations of the state's Move Over/Slow Down law. These periodic enforcement operations by DPS Troopers are planned throughout the year at various locations in Texas, with several operations planned in February.

The law, originally passed in 2003, requires motorists to move over or slow down when certain vehicles - including police, fire, EMS, Texas Department of Transportation vehicles and tow trucks - are stopped on the side of the road with emergency lights activated.

"Our Highway Patrol Troopers and other officers risk their lives every day for the people of Texas, and their safety is particularly vulnerable while working on the side of the road. where the slightest mistake by a passing motorist can end in tragedy," said DPS Director Steven Mc-Craw. "While our officers are serving and protecting Texans, we're asking drivers to do their part by adhering to the law - simply move over or slow down.'

Specifically, Texas law states that a driver must either:

 Vacate the lane closest to the applicable vehicles stopped on the side of the road (if the road has multiple lanes traveling in the same direction), or

•Slow down 20 mph below the speed limit. (If the speed limit is below 25 mph, the driver must slow down to 5 mph.)

Drivers should only move over if they can do so safely and legally; otherwise, they should slow

"In light of the numerous vehicle crashes that occur in Texas and across the nation on a daily basis, and the unfortunate fact the many still violate the state law that has been in effect for nearly 15 years, we are increasing our enforcement and education efforts related to this law. said Director McCraw. "In addition to complying with the law to protect those who work on the side of the road, we encourage motorists to show the same courtesy to fellow drivers stopped along our roadways. Let's all get home

Violations of the law can result in a fine of up to \$200; the fine increases to \$500 if there is property damage. If violators cause bodily injury, they can be charged with a Class B misdemeanor, resulting in possible jail time and a maximum fine of \$2,000.

Preliminary data from 2017 shows that DPS issued more than 10,650 warnings and citations to motorists violating the Move Over/Slow Down



Brady Briefing: Building American Prosperity

President Trump will deliver his first State of the Union Speech this week. My guest is Jim "Mac" McInvale, a successful businessman, founder of Gallery Furniture and world-class philanthropist who embodies the American Dream.

That means a stronger economy with more jobs, fairer taxes, and bigger paychecks for Texans and taxpayers nationwide.

I'm relieved Senator Schumer and Congressional Democrats reversed course and joined Republicans to reopen the government. What a needless shutdown—and for what? An unrelated agreement on immigration with a deadline

weeks from now?

The shutdown hurt our troops, delayed crucial Harvey disaster aid, and risked children's health insurance for more than 400,000 Texas children and pregnant mothers. With tens of thousands of Texas victims of Hurricane Harvey waiting for assistance Senate Democrats, led by Schumer, are still refusing to approve the \$81 billion disaster relief bill passed by the GOP House last year.




