

Gulf Coast Regional Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (TGCR VOAD) with a proclamation for their efforts to promote preparedness during hurricane season.

"Our ability to collaborate before, during and after a crisis is a major strength in our region," said Harris County Judge Ed Emmett. "As we continue to recover from the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey, I encourage residents to prepare in advance of the next storm."

Early predictions for 2018 call for another above-average hurricane season. According to forecasters 12 to 14 tropical storms could develop between June 1 and November 30, six to eight of which may become hurricanes three to five major hurri-

"Regardless of the number of hurricanes predicted, I would remind our residents that it only takes one to devastate a community," added Judge Emmett. "Be assured that the county will continue to work to prepare our communities, but it is up to each individual to prepare themselves and their fam-

Keilah, an 11th-grader at the magnet campus, had no idea what to expect when a small crowd of district-level administrators and her parents walked into her classroom. She was nearly in tears as she realized she had been selected as a 2018 Argo.

Just as surprised was Doyle, an aquatic science teacher at "Big" Mac. Both he and Keilah will work with researchers and educators between June 25-July 2 to study sea turtles.

Man found shot during robbery died at hospital

Houston police are investigating the fatal shooting of a male that occurred at 9090 Greens Road about 10 p.m. on Monday, April 30.

According to HPD Homicide Division Detectives A. Barr and M. Perez, about 10 p.m., the victim entered the Citgo gas station and robbed the two store clerks at gunpoint. He then fled the scene on foot eastbound on Greens Road.

Responding HPD patrol officers subsequently located him a few

minutes later at the corner of Greens Road and Seminar Drive where he had been shot. He was transported to Memorial Hermann The Woodlands Medical Center where he died from his

wounds.

His identity is pending verification by the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences.

Parents of teen killed in car crash urge Texans to buckle up

AUSTIN - On the evening of Oct. 28, 2017, Kailee Mills was traveling with three friends to a Halloween party when the car she was riding in went out of control and flipped just 400 yards from her home. Kailee, the only one not wearing a seat belt, was thrown from the car and killed. Her friends escaped with minor injuries. Kailee's parents, David and Wendy Mills of Spring, Texas, were devastated.

"We don't know why Kailee had taken off her seat belt," said David Mills. "She always wore it. We never thought this would happen to us — to our daughter. We know that if she had been wearing her seat belt, she'd still be here. Instead, the girl we called our 'ray of sunshine' is gone."

"No family should have to grieve the loss of a loved one whose life was cut short," said Texas Department of Transportation Executive Director James Bass. "Last year, more than 900 people killed in traffic crashes were not buckled up, leaving countless families, friends and communities to deal with a tragic loss. Many of these deaths were preventable, but seat belts only work if you use them."

Kailee Mills was a student at Klein Collins High School and planned to study medicine in college. To give meaning to their daughter's death, her parents started working to build awareness about the importance of always using a seat belt. Now they're joining with TxDOT to launch the state's annual "Click It or Ticket" campaign in the hope they can help other families avoid what they've experienced.

Statewide seat belt use continues to increase, reaching nearly 92 percent for 2017, yet 929 unbuckled Texans still died in traffic crashes last year. TxDOT's "Click It or Ticket" campaign reminds driv-

ers and passengers that wearing a seat belt is the single most effective step they can take to protect themselves in a crash. Wearing a seat belt reduces the risk of dying in a crash by 45 percent. That number jumps to 60 percent for pickup trucks.

While daytime seat belt usage continues to increase, nighttime use remains lower, leading to a higher rate of fatalities. Last year, the Texas A&M Transportation Institute found the number of drivers and front seat passengers observed in 18 cities not wearing seat belts increased by almost 50 percent from day to night. In 2017, 57 percent of all crashes where occupants died and weren't wearing a seat belt happened at night (between 6 p.m. and


Texas law requires everyone in a vehicle to be properly buckled up or face fines and court costs up to \$200. Children younger than 8 must be in a child safety seat or booster seat unless they're taller than 4 feet 9 inches. If they aren't properly restrained, the driver faces fines of up to \$250, plus court costs.

As part of the "Click It or Ticket" campaign, Texas law enforcement officers will step up their enforcement of the state's seat belt laws from May 21 to June 3, including the Memorial Day weekend.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the "Click It or Ticket" initiative in Texas is estimated to have saved 5,473 lives, prevented more than 95,500 serious injuries and saved more than \$20.7 billion in related economic costs from 2002 through 2017.

DPS Reminder: Skip the trip to DL offices during busy summer months

AUSTIN - The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) is reminding residents that many customers can skip the trip to a driver license (DL) office altogether, which is especially convenient during the busy summer months. Most residents who are eligible to skip the trip are not taking advantage of the option to quickly renew their Texas DL or identification (ID) card online (or by phone). Address changes can also be taken care of online (or by mail) in many instances. Find out if you are eligible to renew online by visiting Texas.gov.

"Summer is one of the busiest times at Texas driver license offices, but taking advantage of technology options can save you time," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "If you qualify for online renewal, you can skip the trip to an office altogether. However, if you must go to an office in person, we encourage residents to visit a highcapacity Mega Center or to 'get in line' remotely before heading to the DL office, if those options are available."

High-capacity DL Mega Centers are primarily available in major metropolitan areas. In addition, many offices across the state also leverage a queuing system that offers customers the convenient option of reserving a spot in line through the DPS website, by mobile phone or a landline before going to the office. option available to customers who are required to make an office visit is renewing their DL or ID card early, which allows customers to choose a convenient time that best fits their schedule, and potentially avoid the busiest times at DL offices. Did you know you can renew up to two years in advance of the expiration date on your current card if you go into an office, or up to one year in advance if you are renewing online? The new expiration date will remain the same even if you renew early. Visit the DPS website to make sure you have the proper paperwork (including documents needed for residency requirements) before making a trip to the office.

To be eligible to renew online, the cardholder must be a U.S. citizen and the expiration date on the card must be within one year. Additionally, in order to renew online, the card cannot have been expired for more than two years. Requirements for renewing online are available at Texas.gov, the official website of the State of Texas. Customers can also renew by phone at 1-866-DL-RENEW (1-866-357-3639). The eligibility requirements for phone and online renewal are the same. The fee is the same for online, in-person and telephone renewals. Licenses must be renewed in person every 12 years, so a new photo can be taken and eyesight can be tested.

Customers may obtain a replacement DL or ID card online, if they are able to provide the 20-character code on the front of their current license or card.

Abbott urges local officials to apply for Harvey funds

AUSTIN — Mayors, county judges and emergency management officials in communities impacted by Hurricane Harvey received letters last week from Gov. Greg Abbott, urging them to take advantage of available funding.

Some \$500 million in funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program are available now, Abbott said. These funds are in addition to the more than \$10 billion in Community Development Block Grant funds approved by Congress and awarded to Texas earlier this year.

"The hazard mitigation funds available today can provide immediate relief and resiliency to your community," Abbott wrote. "As of today, the Texas Department of Emergency Management has received only seven complete applications from the entire region impacted by Hurricane Harvey. That means hundreds of millions of dollars that are available to Texas communities today are not being put to use."

Abbott reminded the officials that local governments would not be obligated to pay the typical 25 percent local cost share for hazard mitigation grants and that \$600 million of additional hazard mitigation funds will become available in four months.

Hazard mitigation funds can be used for purposes

- Buyouts and elevations of flood-prone properties:
- Drainage and reservoir projects that eliminate future flooding;
- Projects to lessen the frequency or severity of flooding;
 Flood rick reduction
- Flood risk reduction projects such as dams, retention basins, levees and flood walls; and
- Large-scale channeling of waterways.

A letter signed by the executive directors of the three state agencies supports the EPA's proposed repeal of "Carbon Pollution Emission Guidelines for Existing Electric Utility Generating Units," known as the Clean Power Plan.

On April 27, Gov. Abbott, Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick and Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton sent a joint letter to the EPA, praising its plan to repeal the plan. They said it "failed to produce evidence of greenhouse gases dangerous enough to necessitate federal regulation."

Abbott says pay for it

Gov. Abbott on April 25 sent a letter to former U.S. Rep. Blake Farenthold of Corpus Christi, demanding that he cover costs for an upcoming emergency special election for the 27th Congressional District of Texas.

Abbott ordered the election to fill the seat made vacant by Farenthold's recent resignation.

"While you have publicly offered to reimburse the \$84,000 in taxpayer funds you wrongly used to settle a sexual harassment claim, there is no legal recourse requiring you to give that money back to Congress," Abbott wrote. "I am urging you to give those funds back to the counties in your district to cover the costs of the June 30, 2018, special election. This seat must be filled, and the counties and taxpayers in the 27th Congressional District should not again pay the price for your actions," Abbott add-

Farenthold, whose tenure in U.S. House began in January 2011, resigned from office effective April 6.

Paxton welcomes ruling

Attorney General Paxton on April 27 applauded a 2-1 ruling by a three-judge panel of the New Orleans-based U.S. Court of Appeals for the 5th Circuit that upholds Senate Bill 5, Texas' voter ID law.

"The court rightly recognized that when the Legislature passed Senate Bill 5 last session, it complied with every change the 5th Circuit ordered to the original voter ID law," Attorney General Paxton said. "Safeguarding the integrity of our elections is essential to preserving our democracy. The revised voter ID law removes any burden on voters who cannot obtain a photo ID."

SB 5 allows registered voters without one of the seven state-approved forms of photo identification to cast an in-person ballot by signing a sworn declaration of reasonable impediment stating why they could not obtain photo ID.

May is awareness month

The Texas Department of Transportation's "Share the Road: Look Twice for Motorcycles" campaign is urging drivers to watch for motorcycles, as crashes killed 501 and seriously injured another 2,101 motorcyclists in Texas last year.

TxDOT's campaign is part of National Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month in May.

"Nobody wants to take a life in a crash or lose a loved one," said TxDOT Executive Director James Bass. "Motorcycles are small, they're hard to see, and it can be difficult to judge their speed and distance. That's why it's critical that drivers take extra precautions to look twice for motorcycles, especially at intersections."

"Got plenty of spark," Randy said.





THOUGHTS FROM MARANATHA CHURCH You May Have a Point There

If you have ever walked through brush, ridden a horse through the woods, or even gone berry picking, you have more than likely felt the sharp prick of a thorn or a thistle. Thorns from numerous plants in various parts of the country have pierced the flesh of many of us. Whether or not the thorns draw blood, there is no mistaking the fact we live in a world cursed with thorns and thistles, and it takes work to protect ourselves from them. These thorns are more than a hassle, more than an inconvenience: They are a curse.

This curse started way

back in Genesis 3:17-19. Because of Adam and Eve's sin, the ground was cursed, and thorns and thistles are a sign of that very curse. The thorn would forever prick our sin-filled lives and guilty souls. Beautiful roses, great tasting berries and many other plants that benefit us also come with thorns to remind us of the curse. Ultimately, this curse on us would be transferred to Jesus Christ on Calvary as another sign that Christ has truly redeemed us from the curse of the Law (Ga. 3:13).

God is holy and makes no exceptions when it comes to righteousness. At times our God is bound by His own holy nature: There must be a blood sacrifice for sin. and there is a clear separation between good and evil, light and darkness, righteous and unrighteous. The thorns formed a barrier between a loving God and a man who allowed sin to enter into his heart. As we look at Scripture we see the trail of thorns as God's presence appears to man, revealing the barrier between a holy God and sinful mankind.

• GE. 22:1-13 - When Abraham offers Isaac on Mount Moriah, the ram is caught in a thicket or thorns.

• EX. 3:1-3 - God speaks to Moses from the burning bush, a bush of thorns. He tells Moses to take his sandals off because he is on holy ground. In other words, ÅgDon't come any closer; you might step on a thorn.Åh God later appears on that same mountain to give the Law, warning that if any touch the mountain they will surely die (EX. 19:12).

• EX. 26:29 - God instructs Moses to build a Tabernacle. He specifically tells him to use acacia wood: its branches ÅghappenÅh to be covered with long thorns. They must remove the thorns, overlay it with gold, and then have the dwelling place of the fiery pillar of God's presence.

• NU. 25:1 & JOS.2:1 -The last place Israel camps before they enter the Promise Land is called Abel- Shittim, which means ÅgField Thorns.Åh

• Solomon's Temple, on

Mount Moriah, houses the Ark of the Covenant (made of thorny acacia wood) and God's presence beams from above the mercy seat. Many events have transpired on Mount Moriah, but the trail of thorns is not complete.

• Also on Mount Moriah, they hang our Lord and Savior. Yes, I'm sure you have guessed by now; He wears a CROWN OF THORNS. Eden's curse has become this mocking crown.

Every time we see a thorn, it should remind us we are redeemed from the curse, free from sin, new creatures in Christ Jesus. Jesus Christ, King of Kings, Lord of Lords: He truly is tougher than nails, sharper than thorns.
