# Alvarado Wins Election for Texas Senate

State Representative Carol Alvarado, D-Houston was the winner of a special election held Tuesday December 11, to fill the seat in the Texas Senate District 6, vacated by Sylvia Garcia.

There were four candidates running for the position. Alvarado finished with just over 50.4% to avoid a run-off. Democratic State Representative Ana Hernandez received 24% of the vote, Republican Martha Fierro 23%.

and Democrat Mia Mundy 2.1%. Turnout was light, with only 5% of the eligible voters turning out

Alvarado had run before for this position in 2013 in a special election, against 5 other candidates. Sylvia Garcia won a run-off against Alvarado by over 1000

Alvarado won votes in the precincts that overlap her House District 145, and almost received as many votes in Hernandez's District 143. Her campaign was backed by a large budget, and she also benefitted from name recognition both from her previous campaign and her time as City Councilwoman in the same areas as District 6. In addition, her District

covered more of District 6 than Hernandez's did

Ana Hernandez will return to the Texas House, having won that race in November. Alvarado will have her term until January 2021.

After her election was apparent, a national wom-en's rights organization supporting abortion rights, Emily's List, issued a statement praising her victory and saying she had the skill to work with Re-

# Warrant service leaves 3 officers shot, qunman dead in Aldine

NORTH HOUSTON - A task force of Sheriff's dep-uties and Texas police officers came under fire last Tuesday, when they attempted to serve an arrest warrant on a man living on

Hartwick Street in Aldine.
Two officers from the state Fugitive Apprehension Unit, and one Sheriff's deputy were wounded by gunshots from Daniel Tre vino, 25, who subsequently took his own life, according to Sheriff Ed Gonzalez

The incident started about 1:15 pm on Tuesday, and ended about 6:15 when the Sheriff's SWAT team determined that Trevino was dead. Chief Deputy Edison Toquica said

the warrant was for violation of a protective order for the woman who was liv-ing with Trevino.

Upon arrival at the home at 5013 Hartwick, Trevino opened fire on the officers, wounding three.

# Aldine ISD wraps up computer science education week

More than 40 000 elementary and middle school students across the District showcased coding skills. Additionally, two coding clubs got the chance to visit Apple and Microsoft stores for CSEd Week activities.

The week provided an opportunity for the District to promote digital literacy education by teaching and exposing students to the basics of code and compu-

tational thinking.
The plugged and unplugged lessons taught students the fundamentals of computer science. The students enjoyed themselves as their eyes were glued to their computer screens as they played games, created binary code bracelets, followed graph paper programming activities and played cup stacking codes. "Computational thinking is important because it applies to all fields and can serve everyone," said Superintendent LaTonya M. Goffney. "There is already a demand for these skills. especially in STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) fields. As we move further into the future, more people will be doing work that requires individual decision-making and problem solving. Our job is to help students develop those

# Texas, nation mourn death of former president

AUSTIN — Gov. Greg Abbott on Dec. 3 pro claimed Dec. 5 as an official day of mourning across the Lone Star State in honor of former President George H.W. Bush, the 41st president of the United States, who died in Houston on Nov. 30.

In the proclamation, Abbott encouraged Texans to "gather, assemble and pay their respects to the memory of George Herbert Walker Bush through ceremonies in homes, businesses, public buildings, schools, places of worship or other appropriate plac-es for public expression of grief and remembrance."

The proclamation also allowed state employees to attend such observances. State agencies, offices and departments were closed on that day, with general government operations and services maintained by reduced-size work

The former president's body lay in state in the U.S. Capitol rotunda. Crowds viewed the casket and a 21-gun salute was performed. Official funeral services were conducted at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., and the body was transported to Bush's longtime home church, St. Martin's Episcopal Church in Houston, for funeral services. Crowds lined the railroad tracks as a funeral train carried the former president's body to College Station and its final resting place at the George H.W. Bush Presidential Library on the Texas A&M University campus.

#### Pablos resigns from post

Secretary of State Rolando Pablos, Texas' chief elections officer, has resigned from office, effective

In his Dec. 6 letter of resignation, Pablos wrote to Gov Abbott: "With the midterm elections successfully behind us and the 86th legislative session around the corner, I believe this would be a good time to begin the process of transitioning out of my position and passing the baton to the next secretary

#### AG joins antirobocall group

Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton on Dec. 6 announced he had joined 40 state attorneys general in an effort to stop or reduce "irritating and potentially harmful robocalls" that telemarketers and political campaigns may use to autodial the telephone numbers of private citizens and deliver recorded message

"Unwanted phone calls are both a nuisance and an invasion of privacy, and growing robocall scams could cost Texans anywhere from a few dollars to their life savings. This coalition is dedicated to protecting citizens from these risks and engaging telecom companies in a nationwide effort to put an end to these intrusive calls," Paxton said.

#### Revenue total increases

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar on Dec. 4 said state sales tax revenue totaled \$2.998 billion in November, 7.7 percent more than the amount reported for November

"While slower than the double-digit pace of recent months, state sales tax revenue growth in November was strong," Hegar said. "Increased tax collections continue to be led by remittances from oil- and gas-related sectors, but at a slower pace than in recent months. Growth from retail trade and restaurants, the sectors most dependent on consumer spending, was positive, but comparatively mod-

The sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 57 percent of all tax collections

#### DSHS promotes flu shots

The Texas Department of State Health Services, in conjunction with National Influenza Vaccination Week, reminded Texans on Dec. 4 to protect themselves and loved ones by getting immu-

nized.
"Last flu season was severe, and the U.S. saw a record number of flu-related hospitalizations and pediatric deaths," said Dr. Jennifer Shuford, DSHS infectious disease medical officer. "We have no way of knowing if this flu season will be milder or just as severe as last season We are recommending all Texans six months of age and older get their flu vac-cine as soon as possible."

# Texans look to improve playoff seeding against Eagles: Dallas looks to lock up NFC East when it hosts Tampa Bay

Christmas might be right around the corner, and a numbe of NFL teams will be hoping Santa delivers them playoff berths in their stockings.

Two weeks remain in the 2018 season and while the Rams and Saints have already clinched post-season berths, a number of eams, including the Texans and Cowboys, could be joining them in the playoffs as well.

The Texans travel to
Philadelphia on Sunday to face a desperate Eagles team that could be out of the playoff hunt and won't be able to defend their Philly lost to the Cowboys 29-23 in overtime to fall two games behind Dallas in the NFC East race and last week they played the Rams in Los Angeles. The East will have only one team earn a playoff berth and chances are good that it won't be the

Eagles.
Two weeks ago, Bill O'Brien's team saw its nine-game winning streak come to an end at the hand of Andrew Luck (399 yards passing, 2 TDs) and the Colts as they left NRG Stadium with a 24-21 victory. Last week, the Texans played the Jets and a win would hand them the AFC South title. There's a good chance the Texans got the job done against the 4-9 Jets, which would sew up the division title. But even with a playoff berth in hand, don't expect the Texans to coast the rest of the season and rest their starters. The Texans have a chance to earn the second seed in the AFC, but would probably need to win their last three games to accomplish that goal. A 12-4 record might get the job done, but they would need New England to lose two of its final three games, to earn a first-round bye and host a playoff game. It appears Kansas City is a lock for the first seed

While the Texans travel east. the Cowboys host Tampa Bay after playing at Indianapolis last week. New England should have little trouble with Buffalo on Sunday, while the marquee matchups this holiday weekend will feature Pittsburgh at New Orleans on Sunday afternoon and Kansas City visiting a hot Seattle team on Sunday Night

those games and a host of others, let's review last week's record. A 6-4 week brought the season record to 105-66 (61%)


**Baltimore at Los Angeles** Chargers – The Ravens visit the Chargers on Saturday evening in what is basically a playoff game for both teams. Even though Baltimore lost at Kansas City in overtime two weeks ago, they are still in the hunt for the AFC North title thanks to the Steelers collapse down the stretch (entering last week's home game against New England, the Steelers had lost three straight

ames). This week, they face a hargers team that has played well this year behind quarterback Phillip Rivers (3,638 yards, 29 touchdowns), running back Melvin Gordon (802 yards, 13 total TDs) and wide receiver Keenan Allen (85 receptions, 1,074 yards, 6 TDs). The Ravens turned their season around after rookie Lamar Jackson (687 vards passing, 4 TDs; 475 yards rushing, 3 TDs) was inserted as the starting quarterback. Prior to their loss at KC, the Ravens had won three straight to get back in the playoff hunt. Baltimore has one of the best defenses in the league and that unit will get a stern test from Rivers and Co. on Saturday evening. LA has a decent defense as well so look for Rivers and his offense to be the difference maker in this one. My pick, Los Angeles Chargers

Houston at Philadelphia -The Texans might be facing an Eagles team that will be playing for nothing more than pride on Sunday afternoon at Lincoln Field, which could be dangerous for Houston. In their loss to Indy two weeks ago, quarterback Deshaun Watson (3,298 yards, 22 TDs) was sacked five times struggled. That group had better

have a strong pass rush, but it's their secondary that is the problem. Injuries have decimated the Philly secondary and Watson and DeAndre Hopkins (84 receptions, 1,151 yards, 9 TDs) should attack it from the outset of this game. The Texans defense should concentrate on keeping Eagles QB Carson Wentz (3,074 yards, 21 TDs) in the pocket and go after a suspect Eagle offensive line Philly doesn't have much of a running game, so look for the Houston defense to tee off on Wentz and force a turnover or two from him. This will be a good test for the Texans with the playoffs looming and I think they have enough to pull out the win. My pick, Houston 23, Philadel-Tampa Bay at Dallas – Six weeks ago, the Cowboys looked

like they were left for dead when they were 3-5, but five straight wins have put Jason Garrett's team atop the NFC East standings and a win over the Bucs on Sunday should hand them the division title. Two weeks ago in their 29-23 overtime victory over the Eagles quarterback Dak Prescott (3 131 ards, 17 TDs) threw for a caree high of 455 yards as he connected with wide receiver Amari Cooper (40 receptions, 642 yards, 6 TDs) for three touchdowns, the third being the game winner in overtime when Cooper caught a deflected ball out of the air and scooted into the end zone for the winning score. Many experts thought the trade for Cooper was a mistake, but it has paid off handsomely and has given Prescott the deep threat he lacked earlier this season. In the Philly win, Cooper caught a career high 10 passes for 217 yards and three touchdowns. Look for Prescott and Cooper, along with running back Ezekiel Elliott (1,262 yards

10 total TDs) to have a big day against the TB defense, while ne Dallas defense tees off on turnover-prone Jameis Winstor (2,154 yards, 14 TDs). My pick, Dallas 33, Tampa Bay 16

Buffalo at New England - I pity the Bill in this one because they will be facing a New England team that knows it has little room for error in the last two weeks of the season. Two weeks ago, the Pats lost a 34-33 decision at Miami when the Dolphins scored on a miracle play with no time left on the clock. I'm sure you've seen the video of the two lateral play that ended up with running back Kenyon Drake racing past a lunging Rob Gronkowski (what was he doing as the last line of defense for Bill Belichick's team?) and into the end zone fo the game-winning points. I expect Tom Brady (3,700 yards, 24 TDs) to have his team focused from here on out. Look for No. 12 to have a big day against the Buffalo defense as he puts up big numbers as the Pats look to hold onto the No. 2 seed in the AFC. My pick, New England 34, Buffalo 10

Minnesota at Detroit – Speaking of teams in trouble look no further than the Minnesota Vikings who look putrid on offense two weeks ago in their 21-7 loss at Seattle on Monday Night Football. Quarterback Kirk Cousins (3 698 yards, 24 TDs) struggled all night long and produced a lone ouchdown late in the game after the outcome had been decided. He should fare better this week against a disappointing Detroit team. Look for Cousins to make a lot of plays down field to wide receivers Adam Thielen (103 receptions, 1,236 yards, 9 TDs) and Stefon Diggs (89 receptions, 915 yards, 6 TDs). The Vikings are also playing for their playof

any team, even the Lions, for the season. My pick, Minnesota Atlanta at Carolina - Two of

the league's most disappointing teams hook up in Charlotte on Sunday and both might be looking for new head coaches once the 2018 season is completed. Atlanta fell to 4-9 two weeks ago after their loss at Green Bay, while the Panthers fell to 6-7 after they lost for the fifth straight time when they fell at Cleveland. This could turn into an offensive shootout as quarterbacks Matt Ryan (4,076 yards, 28 TDs) and Cam Newton (3,264 yards, 24 TDs; 473 rushing yards, 4 TDs) do battle against subpar defenses. Look for Julio Jones (94 receptions, 1.429 vards, 5 TDs) and Christian McCaffrey (926 rushing vards, 7 TDs; 86 receptions, 701 yards, 6 TDs) to have big days as well as these two play out the string. My pick, Carolina 34, Atlanta 31

Los Angeles Rams at Arizona – The Rams have locked up a playoff spot and should have the NFC West title in hand by the time they arrive in Arizona for their Sunday game against the Cardinals, but what they really want is to have the No. 1 seed and home field advantage throughout the NFC playoffs. Two weeks ago, the high-powered LA offense was shut down by the Chicago defense, but look for a big bounce back this week by Jared Goff (3,934 yards, 27 TDs), Todd Gurley (1,203 rushing yards, 19 total TDs) and the rest of the Rams offense. This one could get ugly early. My pick, Los Angeles Rams 36, Arizona 13

Pittsburgh at New Orleans Something isn't right in the land of the Steelers as they entered last week's game against New England with a three-game losing streak, which has put their playoff chances in real jeopardy. The defense has been a sieve, while the offense has struggled against the like of Denver and Oakland. Two weeks ago, there was no excuse for the loss to an Oakland team that had Steelers and things get

decidedly more difficult this week when they face the Saints in New Orleans. This could be another offensive highlight show as Ben Rothlisberger (4,227 yards, 28 TDs) and Drew Brees (3.403 yards, 31 TDs) square off offense and this should be a fun game to watch. I think the Saints win a close one as Brees takes advantage of a porous Pittsburgh secondary as Steelers fans are left shaking their heads after another tough loss and don't be surprised if head coach Mike Tomlin's seat becomes very, very warm! KC has so many weapons on offense led by Mahomes wide receiver Tyreek Hill (74 receptions, 1,259 yards) and tight end Travis Kelce (86 receptions, 1,159 yards, 10 TDs). Seattle has a pretty fair quarterback as well in Russell Wilson (2,788 yards, 29 TDs) and a three-headed ground game that can chew up the clock and keep Mahomes and his offensive mates on the sidelines. Seattle's defense could also be a big factor in this game. Two weeks ago in their 21-7 win over Minnesota, they pressured Kirk Cousins all night long and will need another big effort if they hope to slow Mahomes and the Chiefs on Sunday night. 



