Houston asks Feds for $\$ 50 \mathrm{M}$. for 10 new flood gates on Lake Houston


The existing flood gates consist of two radial gates used to release high volumes of water and two flashboard gates to accurately affect water levels on Lake Houston.

and city council members agree that the most important flood prevention pro-
gram in the Lake Houston Area is their request of $\$ 50$ Million from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to add ten gates t.

 applications for about $\$ 50$ Million dollars to the Texas Department of Emer-gency Management to ask gency Management to ask the work on instillation of the flood gates. The Texas agency approved the request and the paper work
went on through channels to FEMA. If FEMA approves, and as yet no response has been heard from the Federal agency,

The 10 new gates would in effect allow the City of Houston to release water at a much higher rate pri emergency events. It would give the City of control lake levels. long spillway that over runs when the lake floods. "This potential project is a major modification of the operation and purpose of Lake Houston." said Zeve.

## LAWMAKERS <br> UNVEIL PROPERTY TAX REFORM PLAN

(Austin) Taxing entities, including local
school districts, would have to get permission
from voters to raise property taxes more th
2.5 percent annually under identical legisla tion filed in both cham-
bers Thursday. Today entities with taxing authority can increase taxes up to eight percent weigh in. These bills, SB 2 and HB 2 , are the first step in fulfilling
state leadership's prom state leadership's pro
to enact property tax to enact property ta Texas, says Lt. Governor Dan Patrick. "People
desperately need prope desperately need propert
tax reform, our businesses need property tax reform, and we have set out, on this date, early in
session...with a major piece of legislation," he said. "We are setting the tone for the rest of the session on this issue."
Under the proposal, only taxing authorities who bring in less than \$15 million in annual revenue
would be exempt from the would be exempt from th

The bill would also change how tax ratification elections are
conducted. Right now, if a taxing entity other than property tax rate that exceeds the rollback rate, that eight percent cap on annual tax growth, then

property. It would put strict requirements on public notices for ta
doption hearings, including the propos tax rate, the rollback rate, formulas for how those rates are reached,
and the average amount of tax levied on property in the jurisdiction. It also includes new rules about
who can serve on apprai al review boards and ncludes more taxpayer protections in appraisal

In the past, local urned out in force to oppose caps on taxing growth, saying it harms needed services in their home communities. So far, those efforts have ucceeded, as similar reach the governor's des in previous sessions. Patrick said that while h opes local officials will this issue, ultimately property tax reform is coming. "We have been
stopped time after time in the past by a total resistance to reform," he said. "The days of saying holl we're going to kill the change'...that day is over."

Department of Public Safe ty as non-U.S. citizens have a matching voter registration record in Texas and about 58,000 of those have voted in one or more
