

The five soccer fields in

Precinct 1 will be built in Blue Ridge Park, located in far southwest Harris County between the Sam Houston Tollway and FM 2234. The soccer fields are among the first developments in the largely unde-veloped Blue Ridge Park area, fulfilling an unmet community need for accessible recreational greens-pace while also helping to reduce the risk of future flooding events for residents living in the Sims Bayou watershed.

The three soccer fields

in Precinct 4 will be con-structed in Alabonson Park along Bingle Road between Alabonson Road and White Oak Bayou in northwest Houston.

Free Pet License offered by Harris County

Shelter waives pet-license fee with purchase of a microchip in an effort to get more lost pets home

HOUSTON (July 1, 2019)—More than half the animals that enter Harris County Animal Shelter are stray and on average less than 8% arrive with any identification making it impossible to reunite the lost animals with an owners. In an effort to help keep more pets with their people, Harris County Animal Shelter will license pets for free (up to \$60 value) with the purchase of a \$15 $\,$ microchip July 1st through July 31st. Microchips and a free one-year Harris County pet license will be administered during shelter operating hours weekdays from 1pm-5:30pm and weekends from 11am-4p.m. An appointment can also be made at the shelter's Pet Wellness Clinic weekdays 8am-5pm and Saturday 9am-4pm by calling (281) 999-3191. Proof or rabies vaccination is required.

"July is National Pet Loss Prevention Month and we are urging the community to ensure their pets wear a collar with identification tags and are microchipped (incase the collar is removed), so we have a way to swiftly return pets to their owners in the event they become lost and end up at our shelter," said Dr. Michael White, Director Harris County Animal Shelter. "Microchipping and placing proper identification on your pets is also one way to help reduce shelter overcrowding, because it enables us to quickly return animals to owners instead of their pets waiting at the shelter for their owners to -which frees up space for the pets that truly need to be here.'

Every stray animal that is brought to Harris County Animal Shelter is scanned twice upon intake for a microchip; their photos are uploaded immediately to Petharbor.com and CountyPets.com as well as registered to FindingRover.com, a program that utilizes facial recognition technology to reunite lost pets with owners.

All cats and dogs in unincorporated Harris County over the age of three-months are required to be vaccinated for rabies and maintain a pet license through the county. Violations can result in a citation and fine up to

Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee on the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo 11 Moon Landing

I thank them for all that they do. I urge all who will reads these words to maintain that same sense of discovery and exploration, and wonder what lies next for us. And, I evoke President Kennedy's admonition to us from 58 years ago, that we should not be motivated simply by what is easy, but that we should meet the difficult challenge and savor what can be accomplished by our collective efforts. I congratulate all from NASA who have made the endeavor of space flight their life's work"

Washington, D.C. - Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee, a Senior Member of the House Committees on Judiciary, Homeland Security, and Budget, issued this statement on the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo 11 Moon landing:

"Since the beginning of mankind, we have been driven by curiosity and a wonder of what is next for humanity. We have wondered about our place in the cosmos for as long as we have been able to look out into the night sky and see the stars. And of course, we have been dared by our own sense of imagination and possibility to try to breach our gravity and the heavens. It is with an awe of that sense of exploration that I commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo 11 moon landing. In September 1961, in my hometown of Houston, President John F. Kennedy stood and declared that the United States would send a man to the moon and return him safely to the Earth. He implored us to do so, not because it was easy, but because it was hard. In one-fell swoop, he harnessed our competitive drive and merged it with mankind's relentless pursuit of discovery and information and knowledge

"It was a bold proposition, not because of this challenge, but also because of our standing in the Space Race. Just four years earlier, the Soviets had released Sputnik into orbit, as the first unmanned satellite, and in the process taken the lead in the global space race. Our confidence shaken, we set out to work on the mission before us. The 1960s were a tumultuous time in our pursuit of the moon's surface. Our path was not linear and not without setbacks. Before we could celebrate the triumph of the Apollo 11 crew and the valor of Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, Michael Collins, we mourned the crew of Apollo 1, who died shortly after their capsule lifted off of Terra Firma.

"Before we could walk on the moon, it was necessary first to orbit the Earth. Indeed, the journey to Mare Tranquillitatis was long, and a collective, national endeavor. The challenge would be the pursuit of three presidents until, on July 20, 1969, the crew of Apollo 11 touched down on the Moon's surface. The words uttered by Neil Armstrong were instantly immortalized, because, indeed, it was one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind. This moment was definitely a moment for joy and celebration for our entire nation. But for those of us from Houston, this moment is an occasion for particular and unique pride. The flight to the Moon, and indeed all manned flights, have been guided by the brilliant and hardworking men and women of Houston, who, for close to 60 years, have been the steady hand, guiding manned space exploration.

"I thank them for all that they do. I urge all who will reads these words to maintain that same sense of discovery and exploration, and wonder what lies next for us. And, I evoke President Kennedy's admonition to us from 58 years ago, that we should not be motivated simply by what is easy, but that we should meet the difficult challenge and savor what can be accomplished by our collective efforts. I congratulate all from NASA who have made the endeavor of space flight their life's work."



Texas receives infusion of funds for border region law enforcement

AUSTIN — Gov. Greg Abbott on July 9 announced the receipt of \$15 million in federal funding meant to increase operational capabilities of federal, state, local and tribal law enforcement agencies.

The Operation Stonegarden Grant Program allocation is part of \$30 million approved by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency. The funds are meant to equip law enforcement "to confront the complex and dynamic challenges that exist along the Texas border," according to the governor's office news release.

Local jurisdictions to receive the grant funding include 50 law enforcement agencies operating in these 18 counties: Bee, Calhoun, Cameron, Dimmit, Duval, El Paso, Hidalgo, Jim Wells, Kinney, Kleberg, Nueces, Presidio, Refugio, Val Verde, Victoria, Webb, Willacy and Zapata.

Disaster funding is asked

Gov. Abbott on July 10 sent a letter to President Trump requesting a presidential disaster declaration for the Rio Grande Valley counties of Cameron, Hidalgo and Willacy.

"The recent severe weather in the Rio Grande Valley has caused widespread damage, leaving many without the resources they need to recover from these storms," Abbott said. "Combined with state and local resources, this federal aid will allow those impacted to rebuild as quickly as possible."

Also urging the president to declare the Rio Grande Valley a federal disaster area in response to severe flooding and rain in recent weeks were: U.S. Reps. Vicente Gonzalez, D-McAllen; Filemon Vela, D-Brownsville; and Henry Cuellar, D-Laredo; and Texas' U.S. Sens. John Cornyn and Ted Cruz.

Texas offers aid to Louisiana

Gov. Abbott on July 12 offered assistance to Louisiana in response to Tropical Storm Barry before the weather system made landfall.



Abbott said the state of Texas would deploy its search and rescue team to assist in response efforts and do all possible to prevent any loss of life. "Texans remember how the state of Louisiana came to our aid during Hurricane Harvey and now we are in turn lending our support as Louisianians face Tropical Storm Barry," Abbott said.

Abbott also said the state's emergency operations center would remain at an elevated level of readiness and all state resources would be prepared to respond to any severe weather that may occur in Texas as a result of Tropical Storm Barry or any other event.

H. Ross Perot dies

Texas billionaire H. Ross Perot, a businessman and philanthropist who ran for president as a third-party candidate in 1992 and 1996, died at his home in Dallas on July 9. He was 89.

Perot was born and raised in Texarkana. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy, served as a Naval officer until 1957, then worked in sales for IBM. Perot went on to found Electronic Data Systems in Dallas and Perot Systems in Plano. General Motors bought controlling interest in EDS in 1984.

As stated in his obituary at rossperot.com, Perot and his wife, Margot, established the Perot Foundation in 1969 with the goal of helping fund projects that would improve people's lives. Since then, the foundation has supported education programs, health care research, cultural and arts institutions, veterans' causes and programs to meet immediate human needs and reduce suffering.

Honor Flights Needs Our Help —The number of World War II veterans topped 16 million during the war. Now there are fewer than half a million still alive, all in their 80s and 90s. We're losing over 300 WWII veterans each day. Most of them have never seen the memorial in Washington, D.C., that was built in their honor

Honor Flights Network, a nonprofit, works to change that. Since 2010, it has escorted 222,133 veterans to see the memorial, at no cost to the veteran. Last year HFN took 21,000 veterans to Washington.

The one-day trips leave from a "hub" in most states and fly to Washington, where they visit the memorial dedicated to them, as well as the Vietnam and Korean memorials. These trips are scheduled multiple times a year.

But it takes money and volunteers (guardian escorts) to pull it off, and there are over 38,000 veterans on a wait list. We're running out of time to get all the vets to Washington who want to go.

There are programs to help more veterans get there. The Solo program is for those who have friends and family who can fund the air trip and hotel for one to three days. The Lone Eagle program is for veterans who are not near an airport hub. Once in Washington, the veteran and his escort will join the main group for all their activities. In addition, Honor Flights has expanded to include Korean War and Vietnam War veterans.

Armored Car robbers get life sentences

their lives behind bars for the robbery and murder of an armored car guard and attempted robbery and murder of another, announced U.S. Attorney Ryan K. Patrick.

A federal jury deliberated for eight hours before con victing Nelson Alexander Polk, 40, Marc Anthony Hill, 48, John Edward Scott, 43, and Bennie Charles Phillips Jr. 32, on March 29, 2019, following a nine-day trial. All were convicted of attempted interference with commerce by robbery and aiding and abetting discharge of a firearm during a crime of violence. The jury also convicted Hill and Polk of aiding and abetting interference with commerce by robbery and aiding and abetting discharge of a firearm during a crime of violence causing the death of another.

Today, U.S. District Judge David Hittner sentenced each man to life in prison for their roles in the offenses. At the hearing, the court heard from the victim's family who described the impact of the murder on their lives. They described waiting for their son, brother and fiancé to come home from work and that he should have never had to die

The sentences stemmed from the robbery and murder of a Brinks armored car guard Aug. 29, 2016, at Wells Fargo Bank located at 13120 Northwest Freeway as well as the attempted robbery of a Loomis armored car guard at Amegy Bank located at $400\,\mathrm{N}\,\mathrm{Sam}$ Houston Pkwy E Dec. 7, 2016.

All members of the crew received at least life in prison because each member knew the scheme involved murdering the guard then stealing the money.

Hill and Polk were sentenced to two consecutive life terms followed by 240 months for their roles in both robberies and murder. Scott and Phillips received life in prison followed by a consecutive 240 months for their roles in the attempted robbery and murder of the Loomis guard at Amegy Bank.

Hill conducted extensive surveillance at both locations and was there during the time of the Wells Fargo murder and robbery. He was also near the Amegy Bank poised to pick up the robbery crew members in a getaway vehicle.

Polk, Hill's nephew, drove the car that would pull up on the dying guard for another crew member to get out and steal the money. Polk confessed to his roles in the crimes and admitted he knew the leader intended to "lay [the guard down" so he could easily steal the money from the dying armored guard.

Phillips recruited Trayvees Duncan-Bush, 32, also of Houston, who would take the money off of the dying guard. He made sure that Duncan-Bush had a phone, instructions and a hotel room in preparation for the robbery/murder plot. Scott acted as an outside perimeter lookout. He alerted the crew via cell phone when the armored truck was headed towards the bank and watched for law enforce-

At trial, the jury heard that a now-deceased individual

Suspects Arrested, Charged in Man's Death on Mesa Road

Houston police have arrested three suspects charged in the death of a man found at 9700 Mesa Road about 6:15 a.m. on Sunday (June 9).

Marquise Da Shawn Bass (b/m, 24), Cordarrell Jamond Pickens (b/m, 25), and Louis Woods (b/m, 20) are all charged with murder in the 230th State District Court. Booking photos of the three suspects are attached to this news release

They are accused in the death of Gregory Brooks, 37, who suffered blunt force trauma and was pronounced dead at the scene

HPD Homicide Division Detectives N. Sharp and K. Fregia reported:

HPD patrol officers responded to a person down call on a sidewalk at the above address and found Mr. Brooks deceased. A preliminary investigation determined Brooks had been assaulted by at least three to four unnown suspects and died from his injuries.

Further investigation identified Bass, Pickens and Woods as suspects in this case and they were all arrested without incident.

had allegedly led the robbery crew, which would conduct extensive surveillance of banks' ATMs and armored car routes before executing the robberies. The plan involved the leader lying in wait for the guard to begin service of the ATM. He would then shoot the guard from a distance with a high caliber rifle so another member of the robbery crew could pull up and take the money.

When law enforcement moved in to arrest the subjects Dec. 7, 2016, the leader of the crew allegedly came out firing his weapon and police responded, killing him.

Those sentenced today will remain in custody pending transfer to a U.S. Bureau of Prisons facility to be determined in the near future.

Duncan-Bush had pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit interference with commerce by robbery and aiding and abetting discharge of a firearm during a crime of violence prior to trial. He is set for sentencing Aug. 14, 2019, at which time he faces up to 20 years in prison.

The FBI, Houston Police Department and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacoo, Firearms and Explosives conducted the investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Heather Winter and Richard Hanes are prosecuting the case

The case is an example of coordination between law enforcement who are part of the Houston Law Enforcement Violent Crime Initiativehttps://www.justice.gov/usao-sdtx/ pr/authorities-announce-initiative-targeting-houston-vioent-offenders>. The goal is to proactively fight and reduce violent crime across the Greater Houston area by targeting the region's most violent offenders, augmenting investigative and prosecutorial efforts, and enhancing training, public awareness and education.

It was brought as part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program that has been historically successful in bringing together all levels of law enforcement to reduce violent crime and make our neighborhoods safer for every-






