### North Houston District celebrates innovative Augmented Reality mural, Spreading Knowledge, at Harris County's Aldine Branch Library

The North Houston District invites the public to experience the new Augmented Reality feature of Spreading Knowledge, an over-sized mural by Houston artist Dual which brightens up Harris County's Aldine Branch Library. The installation is the first in the North Houston District's new

public art program, being planned and produced by UP Art Studio, a local civic art firm. The District successfully applied for an AARP Community Challenge Grant to fund the project and create their A/R vision; AARP works to make public places more welcoming and walkable for seniors and people of all ages and abilities.

With a smartphone in hand, anyone can experience the "augmented reality" magic of Houston's first commissioned public art AR mural. An explanation of the mural and a demonstration of the AR

feature will be part of the event. The donor appreciation plaque will also be installed.

North Houston District officials, along with invited librarians and library representatives, AARP representatives and members of the community were on hand at the dedication Nov. 16. The original mural imagery was created by Dual. The Augmented Reality component was developed separately by Dream Syndicate, a

### UH looks to shock Cinci in AAC title game: Georgia looks to end Alabama's SEC reign

The first week of December is going to be huge for college football fans. A lot of attention will be focused on the Big 10 title game, the SEC title game and the American Athletic Conference (AAC) title game, which will have a local flavor as the University of Houston tries to take down undefeated and No. 5-ranked Cincinnati.

Dana Holgorsen's Cougars have had a remarkable season and have a shot at throwing a monkey wrench into the College Football Playoff (CFP) landscape.

If the 11-1 Coogs upset the 12-0 Bearcats, that will

leave the CFP committee with a lot to deal with when choosing the four teams that will make up this year's bracket.

In the SEC, No. 1-ranked Georgia takes on No. 2-ranked Alabama, with the winner being assured a CFP spot. Even if Georgia loses, they have done enough in the regular season to be one of the four CFP participants. This game means more to Nick Saban's team. A loss to the Bulldogs would be their second of the season and might make it difficult for the CFP committee to

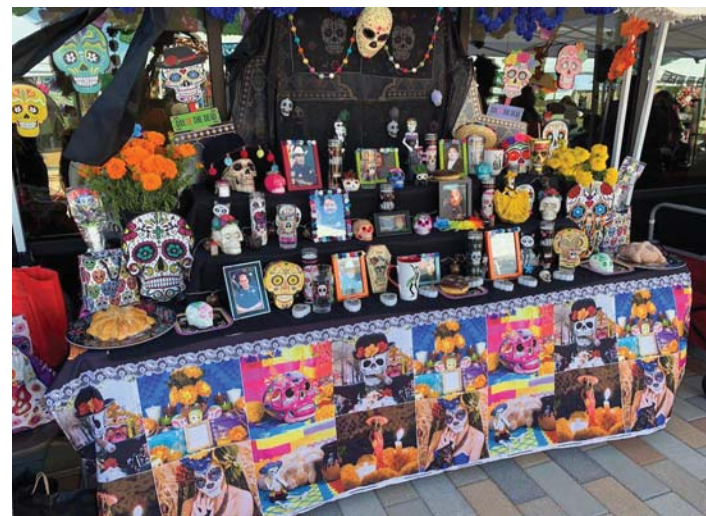

EAST ALDINE – As the community gathered Oct. 30 to celebrate the colorful Dia de Los Muertos (Day of the Dead) on the grounds of the East Aldine Town Center, Annette and Ron Bennett dutifully and cheerfully oversaw the treat bags for children and handed out wrist bands that kids could use to get their goodies.

The two frequent volunteers at community events also remembered their late son, Harris County Sheriff's Office Dep. Shane Bennett, who was killed when he and other deputies responded to a "home invasion" alert in 2002. He was 29.

At the Town Center festival, the deputy's photograph was included on an ofrenda (altar) honoring officers killed in the line of duty.

Nearly 20 years after their son's death, the parents said they "have been blessed" by remaining



close to their 21-year-old granddaughter and her mother.

The Bennetts said their faith helped them recover from the loss of their son.

"When our son passed away, instead of turning

our back on that agency, we decided to become a part of that (sheriff's office) agency in any way we can," Ron Bennett said.

Annette Bennett serves as vice president of the Houston chapter of Con-

cerns of Police Survivors, known as COPS. Ron Bennett is president of the District 2 Citizens' Police Academy Alumni Association.

### COVID-19 Booster shots available to all 18 and up from Harris County Health

**REGISTRATION OPEN FOR THOSE 18 AND UP JUST IN TIME FOR THE HOLIDAYS**

HARRIS COUNTY – Beginning Saturday, November 20th, the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 booster vaccines will be available for all individuals 18 years and older, with or without pre-existing conditions, at Harris County Public Health (HCPH) vaccinations sites.

This announcement comes following Friday's approval of the expanded booster dose eligibility from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS). We encourage all residents to get their booster dose before the upcoming holidays as more people begin to travel and gather with friends and family.

Residents who completed their two-dose mRNA vaccine series (Pfizer or

Moderna) at least six months ago and anyone who received the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine at least two months ago are encouraged to get their booster dose.

All COVID-19 vaccines provide strong protection for most people. A booster vaccine is an additional dose given after the protection provided by the original series has begun to decrease over time. The booster helps certain groups of people maintain their level of immunity longer.

COVID-19 vaccinations are free at all HCPH designated sites and appointments are not required, although recommended. If you are receiving your booster dose, please remember to bring your COVID-19 vaccination card with you.

# UH looks to shock Cinci in AAC title game: Georgia looks to end Alabama's SEC reign

pick them over a one-loss Notre Dame, an undefeated Cincinnati or a one-loss Michigan or Ohio State.

The Big 10 title game will have Wisconsin representing the East, and the winner of the Ohio State-Michigan game representing the East.

The first Saturday in December is going to be appointment viewing for college football fans.

In the NFL, the Cowboys will visit New Orleans on Thursday Night Football looking to get back on track after losing at Kansas City two weeks ago, 19-9. The Dallas offense was unable to score a touchdown against an improving Chiefs defense. The offense struggled without wide receiver Amari Cooper, who missed the game after testing positive for Covid 19. Dallas was also without starting left offensive tackle Tyrion Smith. Look for both to return against a struggling Saints team.

While the Cowboys were losing two weeks ago, the Texans pulled off perhaps the upset of the year in the NFL when they won at Tennessee, 22-13, to end the Titans six-game winning streak. Houston hosts a hot Indianapolis team on Sunday in NRG Stadium and will have its hands full with star running back Jonathan Taylor, who rushed for four touchdowns and caught a TD pass in the Colts' 38-15 pasting of Buffalo two weeks ago.

Other key games include Los Angeles Chargers at Cincinnati, Baltimore at Pittsburgh in a key AFC North contest, and New England at Buffalo on Monday Night Football in a huge AFC East tilt.

Before we take a look at those games and a handful of others, let's review last week's record. A 7-5 week brought the season record to 89-50 (64%).

Now, onto this weekend's game.

## NCAA

**Houston at Cincinnati:** The Cougars are one of the hottest teams in college football and will carry an 11-game winning streak into the AAC title game against an undefeated Cincinnati team on Saturday. Holgeron's team is



solid on both sides of the ball and are led by quarterback Nathan Tune (2,712 yards, 22 TDs), freshman running back Alton McCaskill (790 yards, 15 TDs) and speedy wide receiver Nathaniel Delk (65 receptions, 965 yards, 9 TDs). The Bearcats are potent on offense as well led by QB Desmond Ritter (2,699 yards, 25 TDs/325 rushing yards, 6 TDs). They also have a strong running game led by Jerome Ford (966 yards, 16 TDs) and have a big play wide receiver in Alec Pierce (40 receptions, 666 yards, 6 TDs). This should be a high-scoring game and the Cougars will be in it until the end. I think Cincinnati has more to play for and will make one or two more plays down the stretch to sneak by UH. My pick, Cincinnati 34, Houston 31

**Alabama vs. Georgia:** Alabama's high-powered offense will take on Georgia's stifling defense in the SEC title game in Atlanta on Saturday. So, something has to give. Kirby Smart's Bulldogs are one of the best defenses to ever play. They've allowed just 8.3 points per game, but they will face their toughest test of the year when they face Saban's high-scoring offense. It will be interesting to see how Alabama sophomore QB Bryce Young (3,584 yards, 38 TDs) handles the 'Dawgs defense. He has plenty of weapons to lean on in running back Brian Robinson Jr., (945 yards, 14 TDs), big-play wide receiver Jameson Williams (59 receptions, 1,218 yards, 13 TDs) and John Metchie III (77 receptions, 895 yards, 7 TDs). While 'Bama has plenty of talent at the skill position, the offensive line has struggled a bit this year. If they struggle against Georgia's big, and fast front seven, it could be a long day in Atlanta for Saban's crew. Georgia isn't nearly as explosive on offense as Alabama is, but when you have the type of defense Georgia does, they don't have to put up big numbers. QB Stetson Bennett (1,730 yards, 17 TDs) does a good job of managing the offense. Georgia

has a strong running game with Zamir White (657 yards, 10 TDs) and James Cook (544 yards, 7 TDs). Look for the 'Dawgs to run right at a suspect 'Bama front line. Saban is 24-1 against former assistants, but I have a feeling he will suffer loss No. 2 come Saturday. My pick, Georgia 31, Alabama 23

## NFL

**Dallas at New Orleans:** The Cowboys will play their second straight Thursday game after hosting Las Vegas on Thanksgiving Day when they visit the Big Easy this Thursday. Dallas needs to get Dak Prescott (2,557 yards, 20 TDs) and running back Ezekiel Elliott (695 yards, 7 TDs) back on track after a subpar performance two weeks ago against KC. Cooper (44 receptions, 583 yards, 5 TDs) should return for this game and that should give Prescott and the offense a boost. Fellow wide receiver CeeDee Lamb (50 receptions, 740 yards, 6 TDs) should also return after suffering a concussion against the Chiefs. The Saints are struggling on offense behind reserve QB Trevor Siemian (920 yards, 8 TDs). The Saints hope to have running back Alvin Kamara (530 rushing yards, 3 TDs/32 receptions, 310 yards, 4 TDs) back after missing two games with a knee injury. Look for the Cowboys defense to be the difference maker in this one as the Pokes pick up a key road win. My pick, Dallas 26, New Orleans 20

**Indianapolis at Houston:** While the Texans pulled off a shocker two weeks ago, they will face an Indy team that is rolling at the moment. Taylor (1,122 yards, 13 TDs) is establishing himself as the best back in the league. His ability to run the ball is taking pressure off of QB Carson Wentz (2,384 yards, 18 TDs). In their upset of the Titans, the Houston defense forced five turnovers and QB Tyrod Taylor rushed for two

touchdowns. I expect the Colts to not look past the Texans on Sunday. Look for Taylor to have another big day as the Colts look to get back into the AFC South race. My pick, Indianapolis 33, Houston 16

**Los Angeles Chargers at Cincinnati:** This is an important game for both teams' playoff hopes. Two weeks ago, the Chargers won a 41-37 thriller at home against the Steelers. This game will feature two of the best young QBs in the league in LA's Justin Herbert (2,927 yards, 22 TDs) and Cincinnati's Joe Burrow (2,645 yards, 21 TDs). Both teams have good running backs as Austin Ekeler (573 yards, 13 total TDs) and Ja'Mar Chase (47 receptions, 867 yards, 8 TDs) can make plays downfield. This should be a high-scoring game, and look for the Bengals to make one more play than the Chargers do down the stretch. My pick, Cincinnati 34, Los Angeles Chargers 31

**Denver at Kansas City:** Don't look now, but the Chiefs are getting on a roll, which might be bad news for the rest of the AFC. Two weeks ago, the Chiefs won their fourth straight game when they took care of the Cowboys. They are coming off of their bye, so Patrick Mahomes (3,200 yards, 25 TDs) and the rest of the Chiefs should be rested and ready to make a late-season run. Look for Mahomes to make plays with Tyreek Hill (84 receptions, 932 yards, 8 TDs) and tight end Travis Kelce (67 receptions, 691 yards, 5 TDs) as the Chiefs roll the Broncos. My pick, Kansas City 33, Denver 17

**Minnesota at Detroit:** The Vikings are another hot team and should have little trouble with the lowly Lions on Sunday. Two weeks ago, Kirk Cousins (2,775 yards, 21 TDs) led the Vikes to a 34-31 upset of the Packers. He should have another big day making plays to wide outs Justin Jefferson (63 receptions, 944 yards, 6 TDs) and Adam Thielen (58 receptions, 624 yards, 8 TDs), while running back Dalvin Cook (734 yards, 4 TDs) handles things on the ground. The Lions may be winless, but they play hard. My pick, Minnesota 34, Detroit 20

Tampa Bay at Atlanta:

**San Francisco at Seattle:** The 49ers are starting to put things together and should make it another miserable afternoon for the reeling Seahawks. Quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo (2,112 yards, 12 TDs) is doing a good job of managing the offense. Wide receiver Deebo Samuel (55 receptions, 994 yards, 8 total TDs) is making plays in the air and on the ground and should have another big day against a suspect Seattle defense. Russell Wilson (1,564 yards, 11 TDs) needs to start making plays to wide outs D.K. Metcalf (46 receptions, 637 yards, 5 TDs) and Tyler Lockett (47 receptions, 717 yards, 3 TDs). The 49ers are playing solid defense, and look for another all-out effort from them again on Sunday. My pick, San Francisco 30, Seattle 27

**Washington at Las Vegas:** The Washington Football Team's season got off to a rocky start, but they have been playing better lately as QB Tyler Heinicke (2,390 yards, 14 TDs) has been making plays to keep them in games the last few weeks. They face a Las Vegas team that appears to be fading, and quickly fading. Two weeks ago, the Raiders lost at home to the Bengals and if the defense doesn't improve, they could very well lose again this week to the WFT. **Baltimore at Pittsburgh:** A big one in the AFC North pits the Ravens against the Steelers in Pittsburgh on Sunday. Two weeks ago, the Ravens won without starting QB Lamar Jackson (2,447 passing yards, 14 TDs/639 rushing yards, 2 TDs) as backup Tyler Huntley led the team on a last-minute, game-winning drive to pick up a win at Chicago. While the Ravens were winning on the road, the Steelers suffered a tough 41-37 loss at Los Angeles. QB Ben Roethlisberger (2,259 yards, 13 TDs) led his team to a furious fourth-quarter comeback. Pittsburgh trailed 37-10 in the final quarter, but Big Ben led his team to 27 points to tie up the game before losing in the closing seconds. Look for rookie running back Najee Harris (685 rushing yards, 5 TDs/49 receptions, 337 yards, 2 TDs) to have another busy day against a so-so Baltimore defense. This will be a defensive game and the Steelers will make one or two more plays on that side of the ball to pick up a badly needed division win. My pick, Pittsburgh 23, Baltimore 20

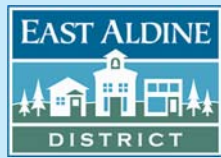

## East Aldine District COMMUNITY NEWS

### Deputy Limon: A true lifesaver, now serving at the East Aldine HCSO storefront

This deputy comes to the rescue from a calmer space. The deputy in charge of the new Harris County Sheriff's Office storefront at the East Aldine Town Center is already a lifesaver.

Rebecca Limon received a medal of commendation from the 100 Club of Houston after saving the life of a man who had tried to jump from an overpass onto traffic on Interstate 45.

"I had stopped traffic, and I just reached out and grabbed him wherever I could," Limon said. The 7-year veteran of the Sheriff's Office said another deputy helped her pull the man to safety. She recalls that day as one of the most harrowing at a time when she was working double shifts on patrol.

Now in the less dramatic surroundings of the storefront, where residents are welcome to walk in, Limon is already staying busy answering phone calls, responding to people reporting crimes and helping them properly install child safety seats.

And during the recent Dia de Los Muertos festival at the Town Center, Limon was busy patrolling on horseback.

The 35-year old mother of boys ages 2, 9 and 14, had help from a friend who was pushing her youngest, restless son past booths filled with candy and Halloween treats.

A graduate of Galena Park High School and San Jacinto



Junior College, Limon is "a married, single mom," since her husband is on active duty in the U.S. Army. He is stationed at Fort Jackson, S.C.

"Some days, I don't know how I do it," Limon said, with a laugh. But Limon is thrilled to be a part of the new storefront unit because she has in-person contact daily with people who need help.

"I love Aldine. I love the people. I absolutely love the people I work it. I enjoy what I do and it is bringing people together," Limon said. "It's beautiful."

Before working as a patrol deputy, Limon was a telecommunications dispatcher for the Sheriff's Department. She also worked for two and a half years as a Precinct 6 deputy constable.

"I am glad to be here in Aldine," Limon said.

As the storefront service got underway in September, more than 50 community members signed in at the office. There were 19 reports crime generated by the office and one child safety seat installed.

Limon said she has to complete training to be certified in installing for the child safety seats. But other deputies nearby can install them.

Residents are welcome to visit the storefront during regular business hours on the ground floor of the Town Center's three-story office building, 2800 Aldine Mail Route Rd. One of the functions of the office is to help burglary victims file reports to make insurance claims and identify stolen items in case they are recovered later.

In emergency situations, though, always call 911.
