Aldine ISD statement on **School Security**

In the wake of the mass school shooting in Uvalde, Texas last week, the Aldine ISD District has issued the following statement about their security protocols:

The safety and security of Aldine ISD's students and staff will always be the district's top priority. To that end, the district is fortunate to have its own full-time Police Department that includes officers who are assigned to all high schools and middle schools, and patrol the other campuses and district facilities. Aldine PD officers are on duty 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Because of this, Aldine ISD does not implement the school marshal program. The only authorized firearms on our campuses are carried by fully-licensed police officers.

All 82 campuses have metal detectors that are used eveeryday during the school year. All high schools and middle schools have police officers assigned to their campuses.

Uvalde mass shooting stirs up Gun Control debate

PROTESTS MOUNT AT NRA CONVENTION

HOUSTON - Protestors outside the NRA (National Rifle Association) national convention at **GRB** Convention Center this weekend, blamed the proliferation of guns and lack of regulations in Texas and nationwide with the increase in mass shootings, as evidenced recently in Texas with mass murders in Uvalde, Sante Fe, Sutherland Springs, El Paso, and Midland.

Last week's school shooting of 19 victims at Robb Elementary in Uvalde has focused the public's attention on the need for government leaders to increase restrictions on gun ownership, rather than loosen rules as has happened recently in Texas.

Speakers at the NRA convention talked of the increased safety by arming the public, but most Continued. See Mass Shootings, Page 2



The ticket was purchased at Circle M #2, located at 13203 Aldine Westfield Road (Suite A), in Houston. The claimant elected to remain anony-


The winning ticket matched all five of the white ball numbers drawn (11-41-43-44-65), but not the Mega Ball number (13). The claimant had an

Fire destroys vacant Restaurant in the Greenspoint area; **HFD calls Aldine Fire** Department for water tanker



Houston Fire Department reports that on May 14, 2022 at 4:45am a fire in a vacant restaurant at 12320 North Freeway destroyed the building.

There were no reported injuries, but damage is estimated at \$750,000. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Firefighters arrived on scene within four minutes to find smoke coming from the roof of a vacant 1-story restaurant. They made an offensive attack and forced entry. A primary search was completed, the utilities were secured, and the roof was assessed.

Conditions deteriorated with fire coming through the roof and all crews exited the structure to conduct a defensive attack.

Additional HFD units were requested as well as a tanker from the Aldine Fire Department. HPD was requested for traffic control. Aerial truck operations were used, and the fire was controlled with two hours. Firefighters extinguished additional hot spots and HFD Arson investigators were requested to determine the cause and origin of the fire. Crews from Stations 84, 3, 15, 31, 64, 58, 74, Rehab 17 and the Aldine Fire Department responded to this incident.

public opinion rejected that theory, and called for action from government to bring a reduction in shootings. Proponents of restrictions in gun sales and military style weapons, point to experience in other countries, such as Australia and New Zealand, where total bans on guns has brought a sharp reduction in killings, both mass shootings and individual deaths.

Even in Texas, they point out that a ban on assault weapons was effective, but when it expired the number of deaths from mass shootings increased sharply.

The NRA convention drew a crowd of about 55,000 over 3 days, according to the city. Demonstrators called for a cancellation of the convention, but the City of Houston claimed that contractually they were unable.

Speakers at the convention included Donald Trump and Ted Cruz, but others including John Cornyn, Governor Greg Abbott, and Dan Patrick cancelled their appearances due to the proximity to the Uvalde

Trump in his speech called for a series of measures that largely mirrored what other Republicans had proposed throughout the day: Schools with a single entryway, with armed guards stationed there, and exit-only fire escapes. He also said

some teachers should be allowed to carry firearms.

Texas Gov. Greg Abbott canceled his planned appearance at the NRA convention and instead pre-recorded a video in which he was dismissive of calls for gun reforms.

"Remember this: There are thousands of laws on the books across the country that limit the owning or using of firearms, laws that have not stopped madmen from carrying out evil acts on innocent people in peaceful communities," he

In his remarks, Ted Cruz said "The only way to stop a bad guy with a gun is a good guy with a gun,"

Cruz, meanwhile, blamed a "cultural sickness," including fatherless children and video games, for mass shootings. He said schools should have a single entry point defended by multiple armed guards.

In celebration of its 150th anniversary, the NRA went big for its Texas meeting, with a sign outside the convention center promising "14 acres of guns and gear."

Guns of all shapes and sizes were on display, from antique pistols to automatic weapons, with some decorated in camouflage and others in American flags. Hundreds of vendors set up booths for the weekend, selling ammunition and a variety of gun paraphernalia.

Outside the convention center, thousands gathered for a protest organized by gun control advocacy groups including the Harris County Democratic Party.

Many there said they were furious that the NRA would go on with its convention after a school shooting in the state just days earlier.

The focus of those protesting in Houston on Friday, in speeches and interviews, was on guns. Many argued for a ban on the sale of assault ri-

Among the demonstrators was Beto O'Rourke, the Democratic challenger to Governor Greg Abbott in November's general election. Beto has called for "red flag" laws and a ban on the sale of AR-15s, sought to extend an olive branch to NRA members.

"To those who are attending the NRA convention across the street: You are not our enemies. We are not yours. We extend our hand, open and unarmed, in a gesture of peace and fellowship, to welcome you to join us to make sure this no longer happens in this country," O'Rourke said during a speech at the protest.

"But the time for you to respond and join us is now. We cannot wait any longer for you," he said. "Those who will be the victims of the next mass shooting unless we act are counting on us at this moment. So please join us now or be left behind."

District Teams Up With Microsoft, **TEALS, and Volunteer Technology Professionals to Offer Intro to Computer Science**

The Aldine Independent School District has an exciting opportunity to prepare students to enter a workforce where technological skills will provide a leg-up to landing life-long careers. Aldine ISD has teamed up with Microsoft Philanthropies' partner, Technology Education and Literacy in Schools (TEALS), to offer courses in computer science (CS) to high school

Next year, AISD will offer Intro to Computer Science (CS) and Advanced Placement (AP) Computer Science Principles. The district is also considering offering AP CS-A, which is equivalent to a first-semester course in computer science.

District Seeks Technology Professionals to VolunteerThe partnership with Microsoft TEALS develops computer science teachers. It also brings industry professionals into the classrooms to co-teach with teachers.

As a TEALS partner district, AISD needs volunteer technology professionals to team-teach the courses with teachers. MacArthur High School, Davis Ninth Grade School, Davis HS, Blanson Career and Technical Education HS, Eisenhower HS, Avalos P-TECH School, Nimitz Ninth Grade School, and others will hold their computer science course during the students' first period.  $Career\ and\ technology\ education\ (CTE)$ courses typically have a Program of Study, which is a pathway that leads to an endorsement when a student graduates. The only campus with a Computer Science Program of Study is Blanson CTE HS, a Choice School — students must apply for admission to any Choice School in the district. The district provides access to computer science to students attending comprehensive high schools.

The work in computer science builds the district's strategic plan, A New Way Forward. AISD continues to build a school culture of equity and inclusivity. Giving students access and cultivating interest in CS early and through high school also ensures students have the tools and skills for success in college, career, and life.

Demand in CS

There is strong computer science job demand for computer science experts in government and public sectors, corporations of all sizes, nonprofit organizations, and colleges and universities nationwide.

"Few careers offer as many opportunities as computer science to solve the global economy's challenging issues. It's vitally important that we continue to advocate for strong computer science education programs to ensure that the nation has the skilled workforce it desperately needs," said John White, CEO of the

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment in the computer science field is projected to grow 22 percent from 2020 to 2030. This is much faster than the average for all occupations. It will also add about 557,100 new jobs.

Judge Hidalgo voices concern over increase in gun violence; critizes NRA

HOUSTON – Judge Lina Hidalgo and Commissioner Adrian Garcia held a news conference Tuesday to release new data showing an increase in guns being used in homicides in Harris County.

This comes ahead of the National Rifle Association's annual meeting in Houston.

According to data from the county's Institute for Forensic Sciences, the percentage of homicides involving a gun increased from 76% in 2018 to 84% in 2021. Preliminary data from 2022 shows that guns have been involved in 87% of homicides

Additionally, Hidalgo's office said 2021 data showed that Black residents were disproportionately victims of gun homicides, comprising 55% of all gun homicides in the county.

"Over the past couple of weeks, our nation has had to endure yet another spate of mass shootings and tragedies driven by gun violence," Hidalgo said, mentioning the recent deadly shootings in Buffalo, Milwaukee, and the shooting at a flea market in northwest Harris County. "We cannot talk about addressing violent crime without also addressing the role guns play in violent crime."

Hidalgo's office said research shows states with "weaker" gun laws suffer from higher rates of gun deaths, including homicides, suicides, and accidental killings. Between 2011 and 2020, data suggested that the rate of gun homicides in Texas increased by 90%, the judge said.



Judge Lina Hidalgo and Commissioner Adrian Garcia held a news conference Tuesday to release new data showing an increase in guns being used in homicides in Harris County.

"The reason is simple — there is a very powerful gun lobby that cares more about their own special interests than the safety of that community, and that very powerful gun lobby feels so emboldened as to have a major conference right here in Harris County," Hidalgo said.


Hidalgo announced her intent to introduce a resolution dedicating the month of June "Gun Violence Prevention Month" to honor the lives of the thousands of victims who have lost their lives to gun violence in Harris County.

"This is about ensuring that people understand the responsibility that goes with gun ownership," Garcia said. "It speaks to the reality that a gun left unlocked, left within the reach of a child, left unsecured in a vehicle can ultimately cause harm in a home, in a family, but also be at the reach of an evildoer who will use that weapon against one of our law enforcement officers or another member of the community."

According to data released by the CDC this month, firearm deaths have surpassed car accidents as the number one killer of young people in the United States.

"If you want to be for guns, encourage commonsense regulations, common-sense safety measures, and fund law enforcement to go after those who will use those gun switchers, those Glock switchers that we have seen that cause incredible harm," Garcia said.


The National Rifle Association issued a statement in response saying," Politicians like Judge Hidalgo embrace policies that release violent criminals onto streets without a hint of justice while the NRA champions the right of lawabiding gun owners to defend themselves, their loved ones, and their homes. While Hidalgo continues to side with criminals, the NRA makes no apologies for standing with law-abiding citizens."




Cartoonist Nick Anderson says he has drawn too many gun violence toons over the years:

Sen. Carol Alvarado on Gun Safety Reform

Austin, TX — The Texas Senate Democratic Caucus sent the following letter to Governor Abbott:

Dear Governor Abbott:

The members of the Texas Senate Democratic Caucus urge you to immediately call an emergency special session to address gun violence in Texas in the wake of this latest gutwrenching tragedy. We demand that this special session include passage of legislation that would:

- Raise the minimum age to purchase a firearm
- Require universal background checks for all firearm sales;
- Implement "red flag" laws to allow the temporary removal of firearms from those who are an imminent danger to themselves or others;
- Require a "cooling off" period for the purchase of a firearm; and
- Regulate civilian ownership of high capacity magazines.

Texas has suffered more mass shootings over the past decade than any other state. In Sutherland Springs, 26 people died. At Santa Fe High School, 10 people died. In El Paso, 23 people died at a Walmart. Seven people died in Midland-Odessa. After each of these mass killings, you have held press conferences and roundtables promising things would change. After the slaughter of 19 children and two teachers in Uvalde, those broken promises have never rung more hollow. The time to take real action is now.

"Thoughts and prayers" are not enough. Lamenting the fact that "evil" walks among us is not enough. Laying the blame at the feet of a broken mental health care system—that you and other state leaders continue to underfund severely—is not enough. We need evidence-based, common sense gun safety laws. Without a doubt, if at least some of the measures noted above had been passed since 2018, then many lives could have been saved.

We must address the physical and mental health of our nation, and confront the public health issue at hand-gun violence. Guns should not be easier to access than health insurance, baby formula, voting, books and enlisting in the military. We are not trying to take away Second Amendment rights. Instead, we are asking for reasonable laws or restrictions that will create a safer Texas for all of us. Taking action requires bravery. The proposed solutions are not new. We cannot wait for another tragedy to occur. Texas has the power to protect its people; it is time we do so.

We ask you, Lieutenant Governor Patrick and Speaker Phelan to step up and join us in passing common sense gun safety measures that are supported by a vast majority of Texans and could help keep a gun out of the hands of the next would-be mass shooter.



Aldine ISD, METRO Officials Unveil New METRO **Bus Stop Designed by Eisenhower HS Students**

Four years ago, four students from Eisenhower High School competed against seven other Aldine ISD high school teams to create a new METRO bus shelter

The eight teams were selected to participate in METRO's first-ever bus shelter project for high school students.

Four years later, their hard work and ingenuity were rewarded when METRO unveiled their design during a ceremony at Eisenhower High School on Monday, May 23.

The four students whose design was selected by the METRO board in the spring of 2018 were Sergio García, Héctor Baltazar, Alexander Baltazar, and Eliezar Guillén. The Baltazar Brothers and Guillén attended the May 23 unveiling event. García was unable to attend because he is working for Amazon in Seattle.

The bus shelter is located in front of Eisenhower High School and features a curved design. A mural on the inside of the shelter serves as a celebration for Eisenhower's 50th anniver-

The three students who attended the event were proud of their accomplishments.

"This means a lot to me," said Héctor, one of the three designers on the team who currently attends the University of Houston. "This means I've left a legacy in our commu-

His brother Alex, who was the artist on the project and is a senior at Eisenhower, said he was happy that he could use his artistic talent to help with the project.

ning project. "This collaboration provided students with a creative space to envision a real-world application for their theoretical learning," Kaplan said. "The process was designed to utilize a cross-curricular approach to produce a result. That result stands before you as a real-world product Aldine students designed and created and that METRO took from a vision to a product. The process was student-focused and teacher-facilitated. The student teams took control of their learning and developed a solution. Students in control of their learning are indicative of a great teacher. Mrs. Arpino, you did a fantastic job guiding your students to create a great product."

METRO President and CEO Tom Lambert said he was impressed with the Eisenhower team's finished product and that it will be a welcomed addition to the METRO fami-

Projects such as this enhance our neighborhoods, and they provide our students with an opportunity to experience real-world scenarios and create something that impacts their community. 






East Aldine Town Center reaps double honors in real estate contest

On behalf of the people it serves, the East Aldine Management District is proud and humbled at the same time now that the Town Center's new, multi-use office building was named among the Houston area's three top commercial real estate structures in two categories in the Houston Business Journal's annual Landmark Awards.

The office building, which anchors the dynamic Town Center campus that was built by the District, was named a finalist in the Special Project and Community Impact categories. The campus also includes BakerRipley and Hope Clinic social service locations, a Lone Star College branch, an amphitheater and audience lawn, playground equipment, the Harris County Sheriff's Office emergency call center and water features such as a pond and fountains. The next phase of the development is for retail stores and other forms of commercial activity on now-vacant land.

But commercial development across the street and eastward on Aldine Mail Route has already begun in apparent anticipation of increased consumer traffic in and out of the Town Center.

PGAL Inc. designed the office building interior and exterior and the general construction contractor was

Brookstone LLP; TLC Trucking and Contracting constructed the roadways and infrastructure. Engineers were PGAL Inc. and Garza + McClain Structural Engineers Inc. Collaborative Engineering Group oversaw mechanical, engineering and plumbing.

With an event and banquet space on the first floor along with a mural tracing the history of East Aldine and a Sheriff's Office storefront, a sleek patio on the second floor and staff offices throughout the building, the central structure has already hosted community meetings and celebrations, District board meetings, and a business networking luncheon. Just outside the building, free, live concerts have started taking place at the amphitheater for the second year in a row.

"The Town Center is already having a 'community impact' and is certainly a 'special project' as East Aldine continues to grow and mature, thanks largely to the family oriented, hard-working nature of its residents and businesses," District Executive Director Richard Cantú said. "So we are especially grateful to receive honors in those categories."

Contest judges were Acho Azuike, CEO and managing director of DC Partners; Steve Radom, managing principal of Radom Capital; Matt Damborsky, Skanska executive VP; and Giselle Greenwood, Houston Business Journal editor in chief.
